- Resolve conflicts directly with those involved
- Take responsibility for my actions

PARENTS

- Encourage my child and their team positively
- Respect players, coaches, referees, and other parents
- Help my child prepare for practices/games (nutrition, rest, equipment)
- Ensure my child arrives and is picked up on time
- Be a fan, not a coach
- Avoid arguing with referees during games
- Support my child's coach and avoid gossip
- Address concerns directly with the right person (Matthew 18:15)
- Follow the 24-Hour Rule before raising non-urgent issues
