BIBLICAL WORLDVIEW

7TH GRADE

OBJECTIVE

Help your student understand the foundation of a biblical worldview and how it impacts their daily choices, relationships, and perspective on the world around them.

WHAT TO KNOW

We live in a world full of loud opinions and shifting values. For students, that can feel overwhelming. A biblical worldview offers clarity. It teaches that God's truth—not culture, emotions, or social pressure—is the lens through which we understand life.

In 7th grade, students are navigating friendships, influences, and identity in new ways. This is a key time to remind them that God's wisdom is trustworthy and His ways are better than their own. When students learn to look at decisions, people, and problems through Scripture, they gain direction, peace, and purpose—even in a confusing world.

TRUTH FROM THE BIBLE

Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight. Proverbs 3:5–6 NIV

This passage reminds us to rely on God's wisdom, not just our own. He will show us the right path.

Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind ... Romans 12:2 NIV

God wants to shape our thoughts so we live according to His will, not the world's ways.

Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path. Psalm 119:105 NIV God's Word gives us guidance when life feels uncertain.

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness. 2 Timothy 3:16 NIV

The Bible is trustworthy and speaks truth into every part of our lives.

See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy ... rather than on Christ. Colossians 2:8 NIV

We are warned to be cautious of false beliefs and stay grounded in Jesus.

TALK ABOUT IT

- How do you feel about the pressure to view things the way the world does?
- What are some specific examples where you've felt pulled in that direction?
- Are there areas of your life where you could apply the truth of God's Word more consistently?
- How can we know that God's path is right—even when the world says something different?

Affirm your student with reminders that they have the mind of Christ, and God will give them the wisdom to see the world through His eyes. When we trust God's Word and His plan, we'll always find that His way is the best way.

LIVE IT OUT

Help your student take real steps toward living out a biblical worldview by putting Scripture at the center of everyday choices. Encourage them to ask, "What does God say about this?" when they're unsure or feeling pressure. Choose a Bible verse together and keep it somewhere visible as a daily reminder. Talk through a decision they're currently facing and look at what Scripture says about it. Most importantly, commit to praying together for wisdom and confidence to follow God's truth—even when it goes against what the world says.

PRAY TOGETHER

Model a simple and honest prayer that invites God into their thinking and decisions.

"Lord, thank You for Your Word, which helps us understand Your truth. Give us the courage to reject the world's standards and instead live according to Your ways. Help us to trust that You will always guide us in the right direction. Amen."
