## TALK IT OVER

How does the fact that our parenting is shaped by where we look for our identity give our children so much ability to hurt us, cause us to lose sleep, rob us of joy, make us angry, and humiliate us? Where do you see your identity too tied to your children? How does Peter point us to Christ for our identity? Practically, how do you step into getting your identity vertically? Where are you most tempted to find your identity horizontally? How do you know if you are trying to find it through your children? What does it look like to embrace the process? Discuss the danger of the twin lies: autonomy and self-sufficiency. How do we and our children buy into these? Discuss how you can appropriately share your struggles and need for grace with your children. Where do you need God's work to start in your own heart?

#### **ACTION STEP**

I will daily work with God to find my identity and sufficiency in Him through ongoing conversation with Him. I will deepen my reliance on His promises and presence in my family, sharing His grace through the process of parenting.
