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Almost everyone in relational trouble says they are desperate for the marriage they want, not the marriage they have. But learning that this requires giving up their rights and picking up their responsibilities kills their enthusiasm. Why is that so hard? Jesus said we are to take our cues from Him on loving. What models do people follow instead? Paul shares from Jesus that love requires taking non-competitive interest in the interests of the other. What does that look like practically? Valuing the other means deferring and treating the other as more important than you. What does that look like and why is it difficult? Does it seem weird to have a sense of awe about your mate? Have you ever felt awe about another person? Explain. How did it affect the relationship? Jesus exampled humility for us by making our needs and deal his deal. Jesus teaches us to value relationship over personal respect. What difference does that make in your relationship? How can you follow Jesus better in this way?
