TALK IT OVER

Why do you think God created us with a desire to commemorate special events and relationships? If you have been baptized as an adult, what do you remember most about it? Since baptism doesn't save us, why would it be important to God? Why should it be important to us? Baptism is more than a moment. It is a marker. Discuss what this means. Baptism celebrates freedom and liberation, identity in Christ, family in Christ, and eternal life in Christ. Which of those is most impactful to you today? Baptism declares publicly my commitment to live for Christ. How is "Christ living in me" demonstrated through a committed life? Baptism means a commitment to live intimately with Christ. What daily commitments are vital? Since baptism is also a commitment to the body of Christ, the church, how do I need to journey in the faith with others? Baptism puts me on a mission to share the Good News. How is this part of my life?

ACTION STEP

I will identify with Christ by public baptism if I have not yet, or reaffirm my baptism privately by a commitment to live up to what baptism signifies.
