TALK IT OVER

If contentment means you don't need more than what you have to be satisfied, and awareness of what we don't have fuels discontent, what is most likely to stir discontent in you? How frequently do you remember that you are leaving everything material behind on an unknown date? Does that affect you? How? What can you do to refocus on what's most important?
