## TALK IT OVER

The worst-kept secret is that most Christians don't really like prayer. How does this statement represent or not represent your current thoughts? Why do you think one wouldn't like prayer? The power of prayer is in its purpose. The content of your prayers reveals the maturity of your faith. Discuss. What kind of prayers show immaturity? How does prayer on purpose grow dependence on God? How have you experienced it? Do you find yourself afraid to be specific in prayer? Prayer invites God into the details of our lives. Prayer involves us deeply in the operations of God. Illustrate the prayers you do or can pray this way. The aim of prayer is not to inform God on what I think should be done but rather to get me in on what God is doing. How can I overcome my tendency to do otherwise? Prayer begins by asking God what He wants before declaring what I want. How much of a shift is that for you? Describe a Kingdom prayer you pray regularly, or one that you know you need to pray consistently. Talk about this question: If God said yes to all your prayers, whose Kingdom would benefit most – yours or His?
