TALK IT OVER

We are called to live with an eternal perspective. What does that mean? You can't live well for God today if your heart is attracted to what is temporary. Do you believe that is accurate or an overstatement? Explain your answer. Jesus is not saying to not care about your needs but to prioritize the right things, with the Kingdom of God first. How does a person "seek" the Kingdom of God first? The Greek word for "seek" means to "be alert with expectation." How does that speak to you concerning seeking God's Kingdom first? God's omnipresence means God is everywhere all the time. God's manifest presence is when we experience His nearness. When is a recent time you have experienced His manifest presence? How did seeking God's Kingdom and righteousness impact your awareness of His presence? Seeking God first is tied to living free of anxiety. Anxiety means a tug-of- war between faith and fear, surrender and self-will, devotion, and distraction. Jesus' instruction to not "be anxious about tomorrow because each day has enough trouble of its own" doesn't sound comforting. What does it mean and how can it help? How have you experienced anxiety leading to instability? Describe a proper eternal perspective on money and possessions, time, relationships, and opportunities. What is the evidence of what drives your calendar, your spending, and your relationships? God is not calling you to be perfect but to be wholehearted. What does that mean for you going forward?
