The way we use words either builds or destroys as well—how does tone, timing, expression, and eye contact impact our relational conversations? Discuss the impact of positive action, the absence of action, and the presence of only words. How do you know if you are speaking life or death? Where is God speaking to you? Where and how can you improve your world by improving your language?
