Ekklesia (Week 4 of 4)

Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins." Acts 2:38 NIV

Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day.

Acts 2:41 NIV

"Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." Taking him by the right hand, he helped him up, and instantly the man's feet and ankles became strong. He jumped to his feet and began to walk. Then he went with them into the temple courts, walking and jumping, and praising God. Acts 3:6-8 NIV

You killed the author of life, but God raised him from the dead. We are witnesses of this. Acts 3:15 NIV

Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out. Acts 3:19 NIV

They did what your power and will had decided beforehand should happen. Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness. Stretch out your hand to heal and perform signs and wonders through the name of your holy servant Jesus." After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly. Acts 4:27-31 NIV
