So we want to build relational bridges with others that are strong enough to bear the weight of truth. God put you on earth for this purpose. If you spend your life without fulfilling your mission, it's a gigantic waste. We show our gratitude to God for the grace He has given us by extending that grace to others. Join the cause!
