### **TALK IT OVER**

Would you rather ask for help or give help? Why? In what area is it most difficult for you to request help? Individualism and isolation are in opposition to God's design for interdependence. Discuss. Which of the reasons people won't ask for help are most relatable to you? Pride, vulnerability, independence, losing control, fear of rejection. How do you work to overcome your resistance? Recognizing that I need help is the beginning of everything. Make a simple ask: "Would you be open to helping me?" Have you done this? If so, what have you learned? Humility is the courage to admit you need help and are willing to learn from others. How is humility required even to receive help from God? Can you share a time when you humbled yourself, asked for help, and found it grew and changed you?
