Icebreaker: What is the most meaningless TV show you have ever watched, yet enjoyed it? Who is the wisest, not the smartest, person you have ever known?

Key Verse: "Everything is meaningless," says the Teacher, "completely meaningless!" Ecclesiastes 1:2 NLT

God created mankind and the world complete and perfect. He created man with a free will to choose because He wanted man to really love Him, and there can be no true love without free choice. Adam and Eve ended up choosing to sin and were unruly and rebellious toward God. As a result of this brokenness the world became unruly and rebellious toward man. God allowed us to become frustrated with our world and life because we must realize that the wages of sin is death. He promised a Savior who would come and restore all that was lost.

In the family line through which the Messiah would one day come, Solomon was born to King David. God granted him his desire to have wisdom and also gave him power, wealth, and long life as a bonus. Solomon started his reign as king following God, but he made compromises along the way and it led to great disaster. At the time of his writing Ecclesiastes, Solomon was filled with angst. He is brutally honest as he reflects on life. "What's the point?", he asks. "Everything is meaningless." Thirty-eight times he says it is meaningless. He says work is useless. We are like a dog chasing its tail. Wearisome beyond description. It's unfulfilling. We are just recycling old events. Life is insignificant and depressing. The busyness means nothing of value. It's like chasing the wind. It's uncontrollable. We cannot fix the world—we can't even fix ourselves. Life is confusing whether rich or poor. The amount of your resources truly makes no lasting difference. Actually, the more I know and have increases responsibility and sorrow. Solomon understood the human condition but couldn't fix it.

Nine hundred years later, Jesus came. He has more than information; He works transformation. He, the One greater than Solomon, the promised One, is here. Now we have the wisdom of God to lead us into satisfaction as we connect with the God who gave us life to enjoy and promised complete restoration and perfection someday.

The Christian faith is often viewed as another option, an add-on that makes our lives better. This is why much Christian "faith" is so shallow. Reflect and discuss.

How many people do you know who are genuinely happy with their lives? How do you know?

A completely horizontal life has no lasting meaning. What does this mean to you?

- 2. Identify the reason you believe you are here.
- 3. Seek transformation, not information.
