Bottom Line: Knowing God leads to maturity and trust.

Icebreaker: Tell about seeing a celebrity, if you ever have. Who is the most "important" or famous person you have ever met?

Key Verse: But those who wish to boast should boast in this alone: that they truly know me and understand that I am the LORD who demonstrates unfailing love and who brings justice and righteousness to the earth, and that I delight in these things. I, the LORD, have spoken! Jeremiah 9:24 NLT

Though people tend to boast about and find their worth in many other areas, the most significant and only lasting thing is to know God. "To know God is to love Him. To love Him is to trust Him. To trust Him is to obey Him. And to obey Him is to be blessed." That is a mouthful—and a life full of wisdom and direction. Blessing all begins with knowing God. That is why from the beginning of God's interactions with the people He loved and created, His greatest desire has been to know and be known by them. To this very day, He invites us to intimate relationship with Him, and to invest our one and only lives in the all wise and loving personal plan He has designed for us. Fulfillment is His goal for us, and He commits all of His resources to anyone whose goal is to know God.

He not only invites us to know Him, He generously rewards anyone who seeks earnestly to know Him (Hebrews 11:6). Besides the sheer joy of knowing Him as Father, He fills our lives with . . .

- Stability—He is the anchor in the midst of life's storms.
- Security—He is always with us, ready to help us in any situation or circumstance.
- Serenity—He gives us quietness and peace in our spirits, no matter what happens. We trust Him to guide.
- Strength—He enables us to do whatever is called for and necessary.
- Sensitivity—He will increase our spiritual understanding and awareness to the needs of others.

Knowing God is the path to real life. Life is short. Eternity is long. Lasting significance and satisfaction is in knowing Him.

Lead Pastor Dwight Mason shared that the key ways to know God and build trust are through practical teaching, providential relationships, private disciplines, pivotal circumstances, and personal ministry. Which of these has been most prominent in your life with God so far? Where do you believe you need to investigate how God might grow you? What could you do to open your heart and life to that possibility?
