Bottom Line: Life is better in circles, not rows.

Icebreaker: If you could go on vacation anywhere, where would you go? Outside of a spouse, who is one person you would like to go with you, and why?

Key Verse: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." John 13:34-36

Jesus talked a lot about love, even more so as He approached His last days. He was commanding those who followed Him to lead a new life characterized by a different kind of love than the world had ever before experienced. Human love is conditional, personally beneficial, and circumstantial. The kind of love Jesus demonstrated to His disciples and commanded them to show is unconditional, sacrificial, and continual. It is a decision of the head, a choice of the will, not a feeling or emotion of the heart.

This kind of love is so foreign that when it is displayed it is compelling and transformative. It is only possible for a person who has received that kind of love from God and is convinced there is no one in the world God loves more than me. As long as we have something to prove, lose, or hide, we are unavailable to love and be loved like that. This is vital, because the strength of our relationships with others depend on the strength of our relationship with God. A real relationship with God begins with accepting our identity in Christ at a heart level. We sustain ourselves by engaging in the practices that keep us connected to Him, and find our significance by allowing God's grace to flow through us to others. His love and grace motivate us to loving action toward others.

God created us to know and be known, to love and be loved. It starts with accepting His love for us, and growing in our love for Him and others. He wants to take us from the relationally shallow waters of life into the depths of relationship with Him and others. This kind of love is the reason we were created.
