Bottom Line: Purpose brings peace and commitment.

Icebreaker: Go around the room and have everyone tell where they were born, adding the name of the hospital if possible, and something that is unique or famous to that town. If there are repeat locations, the next speaker must say something different about the town.

Key Verse: It's in Christ that we find out who we are and what we are living for. Long before we first heard of Christ and got our hopes up, he had his eye on us, had designs on us for glorious living, part of the overall purpose he is working out in everything and everyone. Ephesians 1:11 MSG

Everything, absolutely everything . . . got started in him and finds its purpose in him. Colossians 1:16

Clarity is the ability to see and hear intelligently and sharply. Clarity allows us to experience confidence, direction, fruitfulness, and fulfillment. All of this is a result of finding clarity in our purpose in Jesus. This is our calling in life. We all have different careers (how we pay our bills and make a living), but we have basically the same calling (where we make a life and fulfill God's design). Our purpose is to serve and to share the good news of Jesus. When we do that, we make our life count no matter what career we have. In our career we have the opportunity to find success. In our calling we experience significance.

Jesus brings clarity to what our lives are all about. We all find our purpose in serving and sharing as He did. As we take care of the things that matter to Him, we find security: He promises He will care for the things that matter to us (Romans 8:28). We find significance: Our lives truly matter, and as we find our purpose, we fulfill our potential for greatness. God is at work in the world, and we have an amazing opportunity to join Him. It is more than an opportunity. In fact, it is a calling we are to fulfill.

The questions every person asks, "Who am I? Why am I here?", can only be answered with clarity when we go to God for the answers. That is how we spend our one and only lives on something that outlasts them. Get clarity.

"Purity leads to clarity." – Andy Stanley. How does this apply to your life purpose?

A lack of clarity creates chaos and frustration, and those emotions are poison to any goal, corporately or individually. Discuss.
