Bottom Line: The reason you need to know is that YOU are OUR church.

Icebreaker: Did you attend church when you were 5? If so, where? Who do you remember most from that time period at church? If not, what did you do on Sunday mornings?

Key Verse: Just as the body is dead without breath, so also faith is dead without good works. James 2:26

It will be the most satisfying and significant thing we ever do for ourselves. It will make the greatest impact we will ever have on the world.
