Jesus loved Martha, Mary, and Lazarus, he stayed where he was for the next two days. Finally, he said to his

disciples, "Let's go back to Judea" (vv. 4-7).

3. Understand our are His So then he told them plainly, "Lazarus is dead, and for your sake I am glad I was not there, so that you may believe. But let us go to him" (vv. 14-15). 4. Expect to in a new way. "Lord," Martha said to Jesus, "if you had been here, my brother would not have died (v. 21). But some of them said, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?" (v. 37). Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die" (v. 25). Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out. (vv. 43-44b). Therefore many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary, and had seen what Jesus did, put their faith in him (v. 45).
