Bottom Line: There is no substitute in a young person's life for a consistent leader who loves Jesus.

**Icebreaker**: You have to wear a T-shirt for one year with one word on it. What is the word and why? Or, you have to build a wall. What three people do you ask first to be on your team and why?

**Key Verse:** Therefore I stationed some of the people behind the lowest points of the wall at the exposed places, **posting them by families**, with their swords, spears and bows. After I looked things over, I stood up and said to the nobles, the officials and the rest of the people, "Don't be afraid of them. Remember the Lord, who is great and awesome, and **fight for your families**, your sons and your daughters, your wives and your homes." Nehemiah 4:13-14

God's reputation with an entire generation was on the line. They had a huge task to accomplish. They didn't pray about whether or not they should do it; they prayed *while* they did it. They didn't wait till they learned how to do it; they learned how to do it; they learned how to do it while they were doing it. People were in danger. There was too much at stake. It wasn't going to be easy, and it would be a change. The needed people were already there, but it hadn't occurred to them that they were a vital part of the solution. The enemy was right outside the gates intimidating them. Nehemiah made a genius move. He rallied the parents and the families as he made the vision personal to everyone. He made it clear that this was about their families, and it was a game-changer. The parents became the champions of the story as they stood in the gap for their children!

Nehemiah was fighting for a generation that was at risk of not knowing who God really was. Everyone began to realize it was "our" problem, and the parents became heroes in the hearts of their kids. As they worked together, they rebuilt the walls and gates of the city in 52 days. The skeptics were astonished, the leaders and families were amazed, and the kids and teenagers saw a bigger God! This is what we want for NewPointe! We want to work together to do what seems to be impossible so that a generation can see God in a new way. Each of us has the opportunity to change a child's understanding of God by becoming a consistent leader in their life. We want to reimagine the world we are designing for the next generation. We can leverage what we have to do it!
