Bottom Line: A regular prayer life will make my relationship with God personal and powerful, and will change my perspective.

Icebreaker: Did you grow up in a home where prayer was a normal exercise? If so, when did the family pray together? Were there any prayers you memorized as a child?

Key Verse: The Lord is close to all those who call on him, yes, to those who call on him in truth. Psalm 145:18

How did prayer get so complicated? Probably it is the top area where most Christians feel like they fail to live up to expectations. There have been so many classes and courses on how to pray, the correct order for our prayer topics, in whose name we should pray, and more, that many Christians just assume they'll never get it right.

Now, some people DO have the gift of intercession, which is a special and intense form of intercededing or pleading or behalf of the needs of other people. But for most of us, we are missing the point about prayer when we are trying so hard to "get it right." Prayer is a dialogue, a conversation, between us and the one who loves us most. Jesus Himself told us that when we pray, we should call Him our Father. The sample prayer He taught us to pray is simple: a conversation between a father and a dearly loved child.

We are commanded to pray, true. But even more than that, we are privileged to pray. He invites us to come to Him with confidence because we know He loves us with a tender love, but has all the power and wisdom to do what is best, as well. Children don't need to be told how to talk to a father who loves them dearly. They just need to spend time with him, and communication begins to flow. That's the way it works with our heavenly Father as well. Just spend time with Him. Open your heart and your mouth, and start talking. Share your heart with Him, and then listen quietly. You will learn to recognize His voice as He speaks to your own heart. He is close to everyone who calls out to Him. He's your Father.

LOOK IT OVER 👹

The Lord's Prayer, the prayer Jesus taught as a sample prayer for talking to our Father, gives us a few vital communication topics for our regular conversations with God. Where are you weak? Where are you strong?

Our Father in heaven, may your name be kept holy. (Talk about His greatness and thank Him.)

May your Kingdom come soon. May your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. (Start with you. Surrender your will to God. Talk specifically.)

Give us today the food we need, (Share your needs with Him.)

and forgive us our sins, as we have forgiven those who sin against us.

And don't let us yield to temptation,

but rescue us from the evil one. (Acknowledge your need for peace, pardon, relational help, and protection.)

This week consider taking some next steps together as a group:

- 1. Agree on three specific prayer requests the group will share for the church during the campaign.
- 2. Perhaps identify a time during the day when everyone will stop for one minute and pray together.
